## The University of Scranton Policy

### Free Assembly Policy

Orderly and rational discussion should continue to be the hallmark of University communications. The promotion of such discussion is one of the principal objectives of any educational community committed to the active pursuit of truth, goodness and unity. This educational community, imbued as it also is with Judeo-Christian ideals, requires nothing less.

The University readily acknowledges the rights of members to express their views by way of individual or collective protest on issues. A student or faculty member contemplating such protests to request a protest permit

from the Vice President of Student Life & Dean of Students. If the request is approved, the Vice President of Students will issue a written permit and furnish a copy to the student. The University is committed to providing an educational environment that is free from harassment and discrimination.
